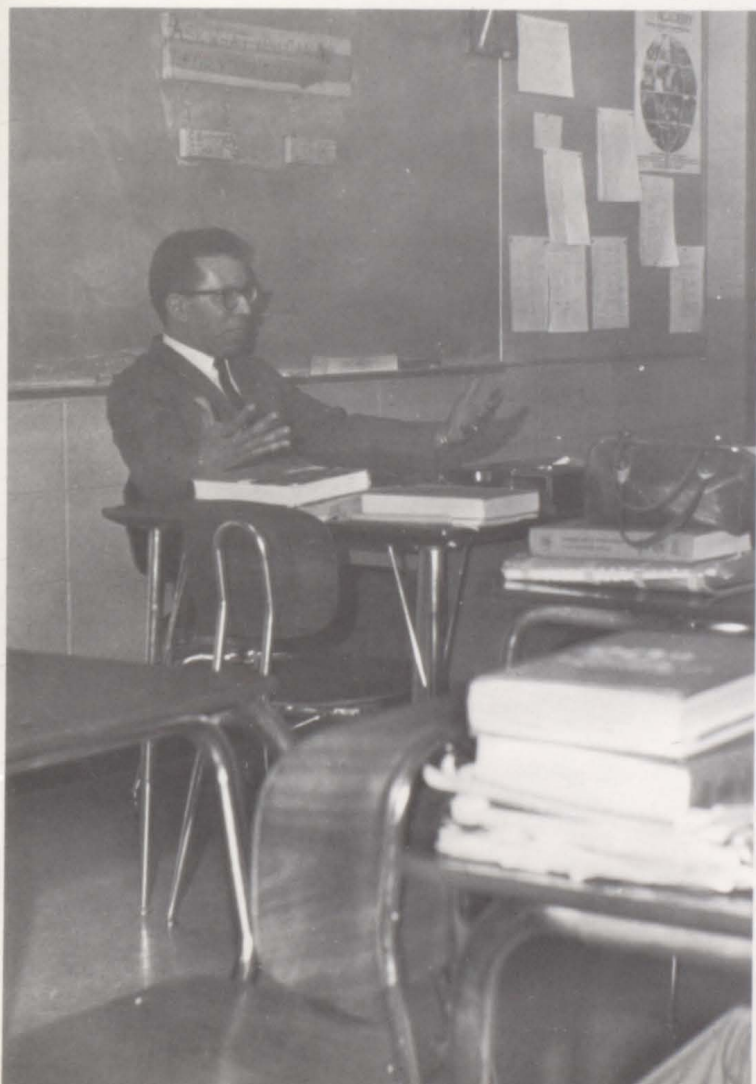

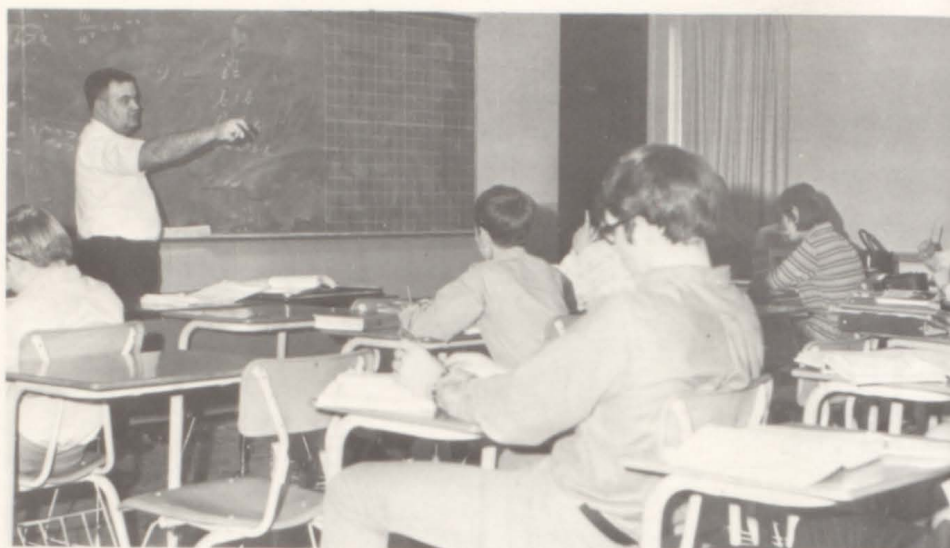
Math and Science

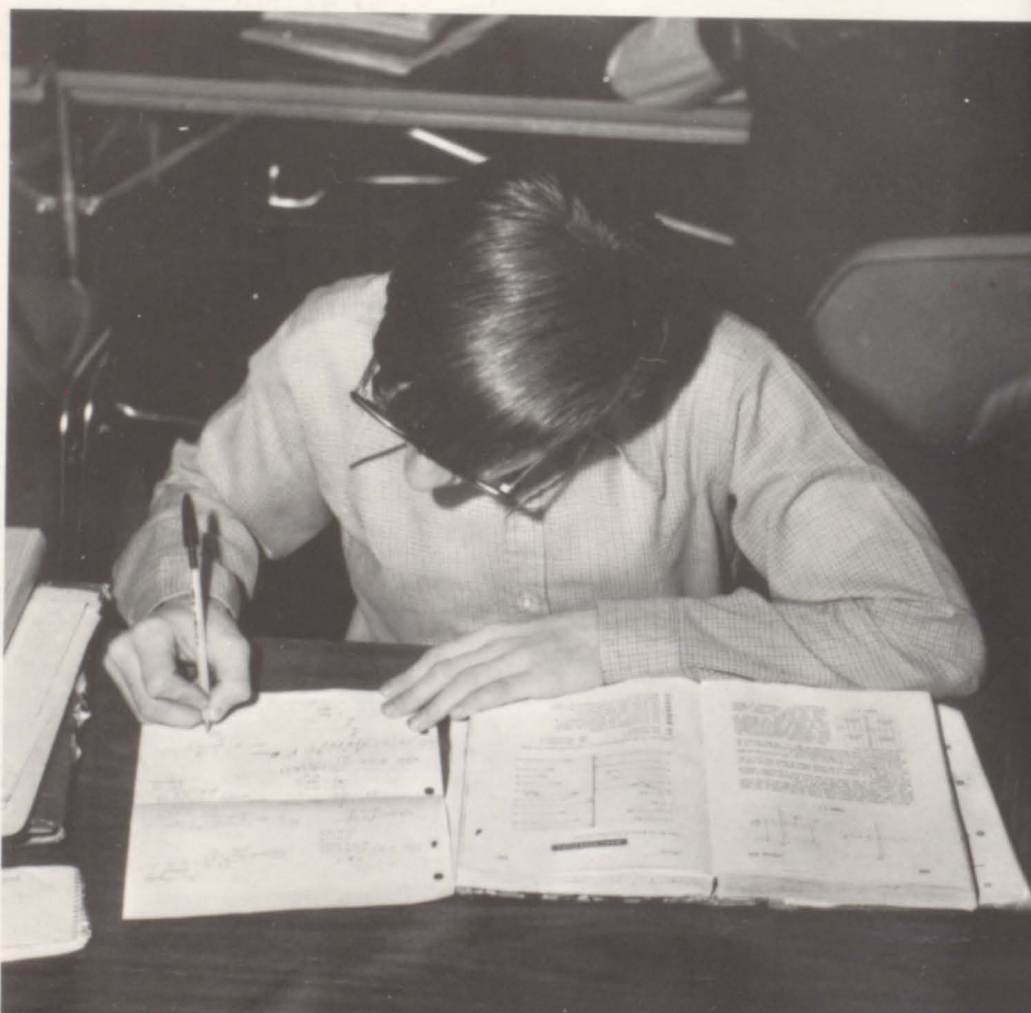
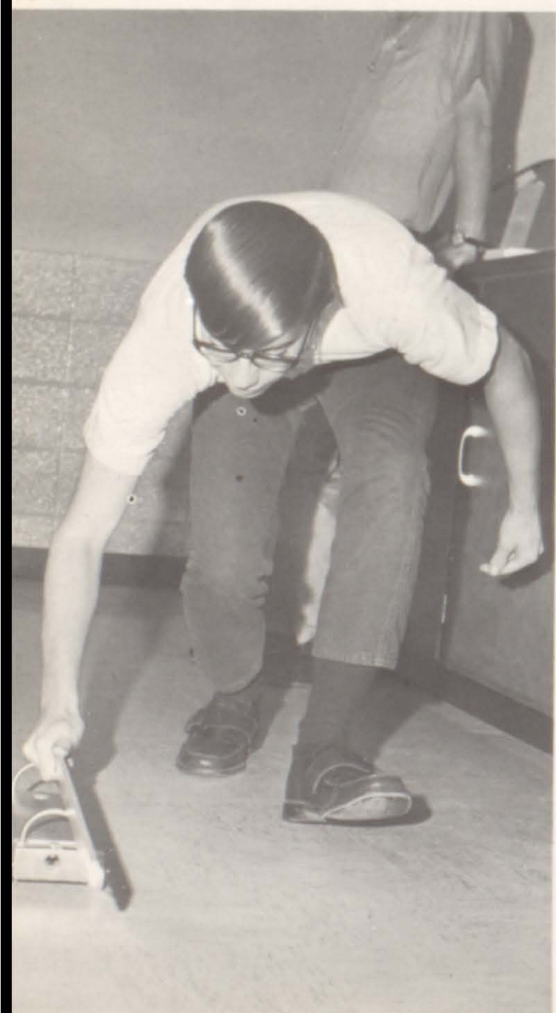

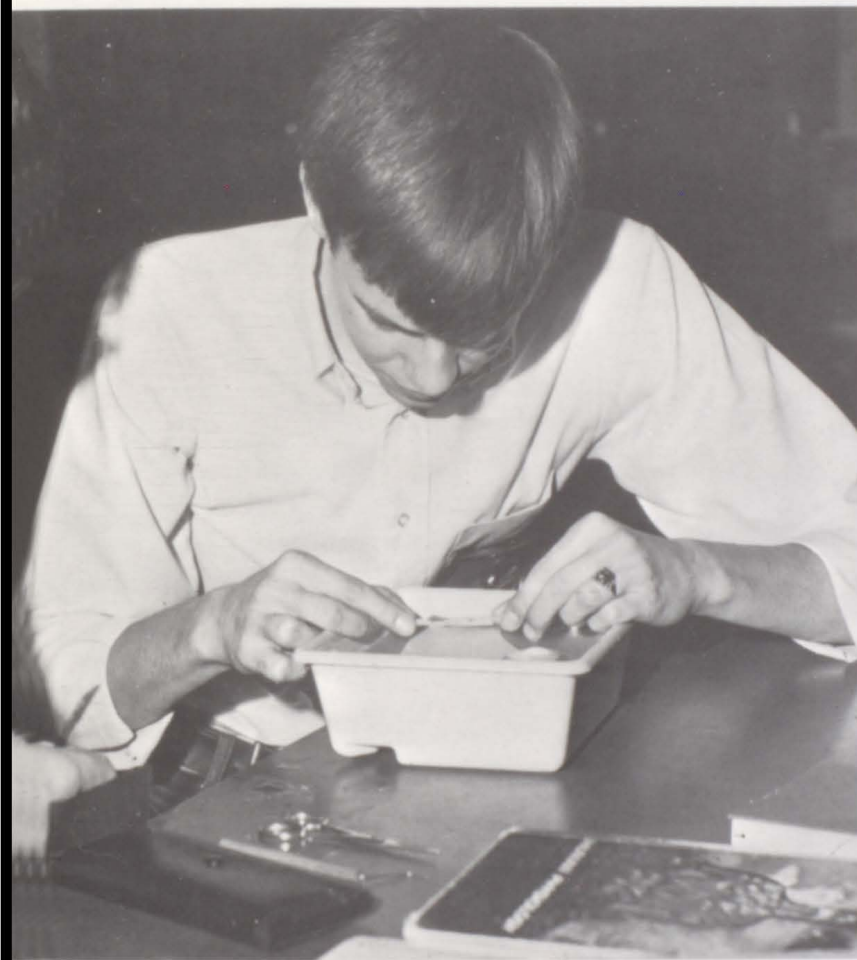

Business and office education gives students a skill in one or more of the many techniques and procedures used in the modern office and the coordinating and communication of information.

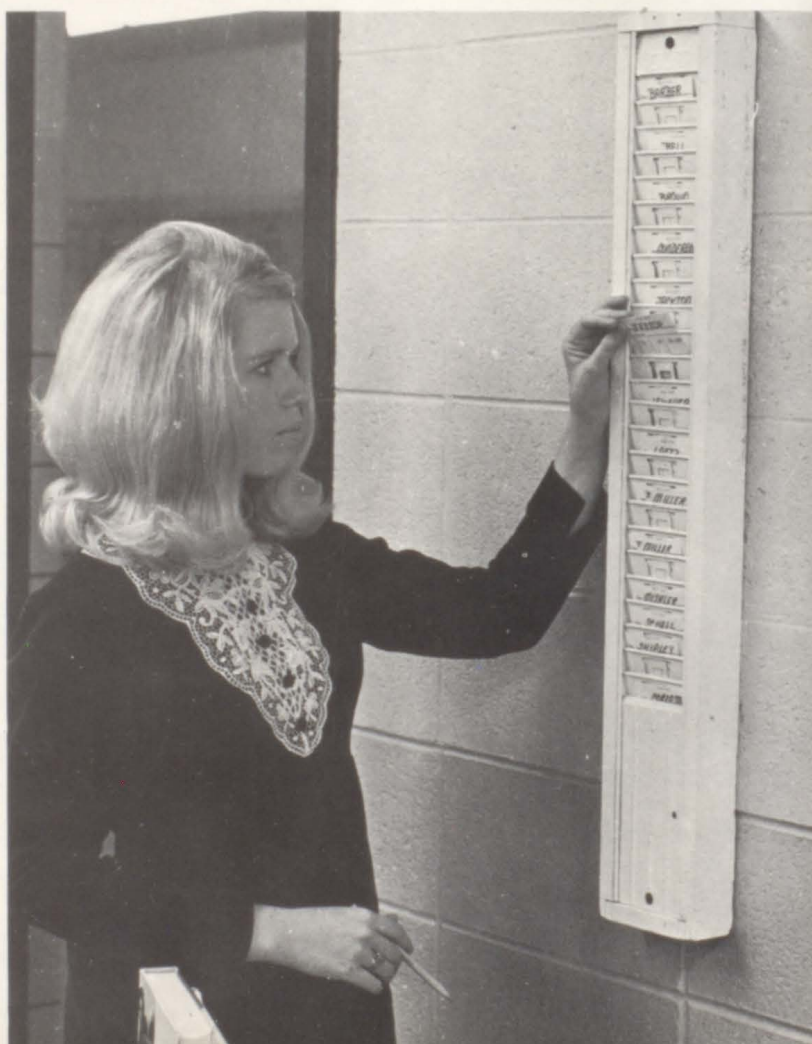

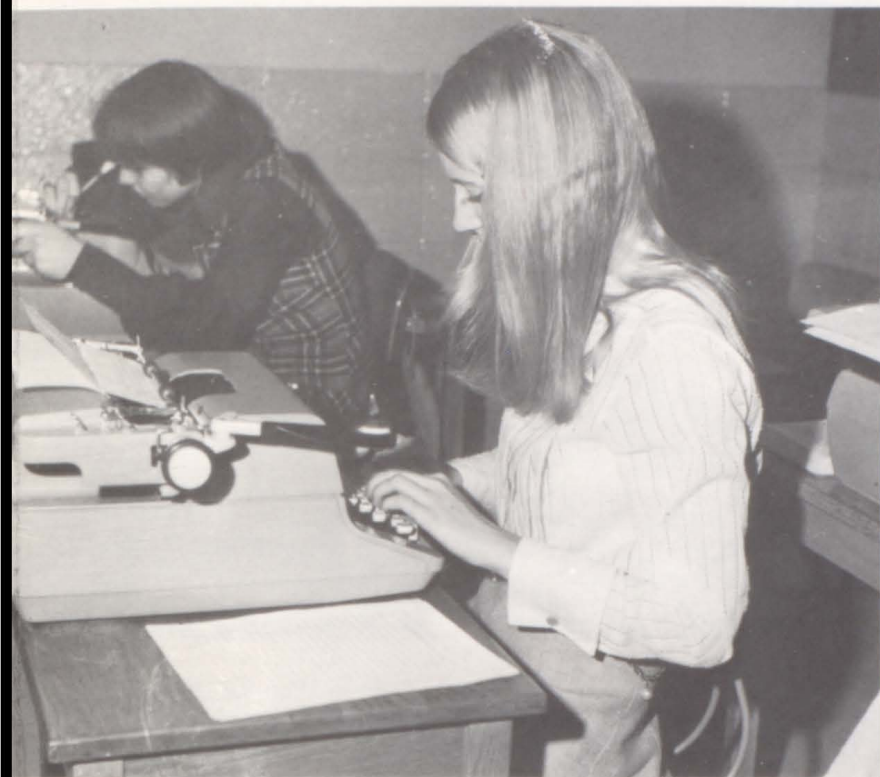

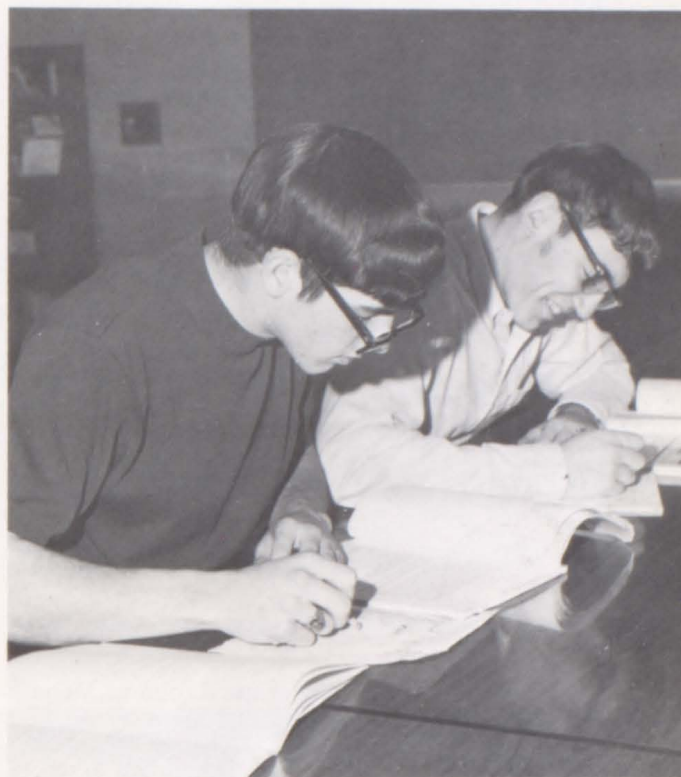

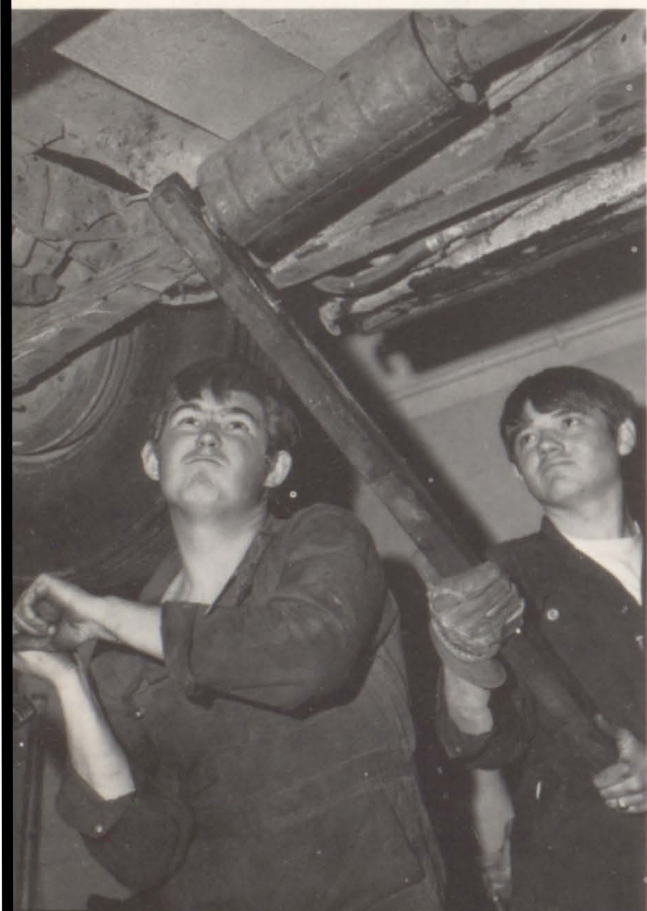

Juniors are involved in all facets of school life and provide a great contribution to the student body. The class of '71 looks forward to becoming even more involved as seniors.

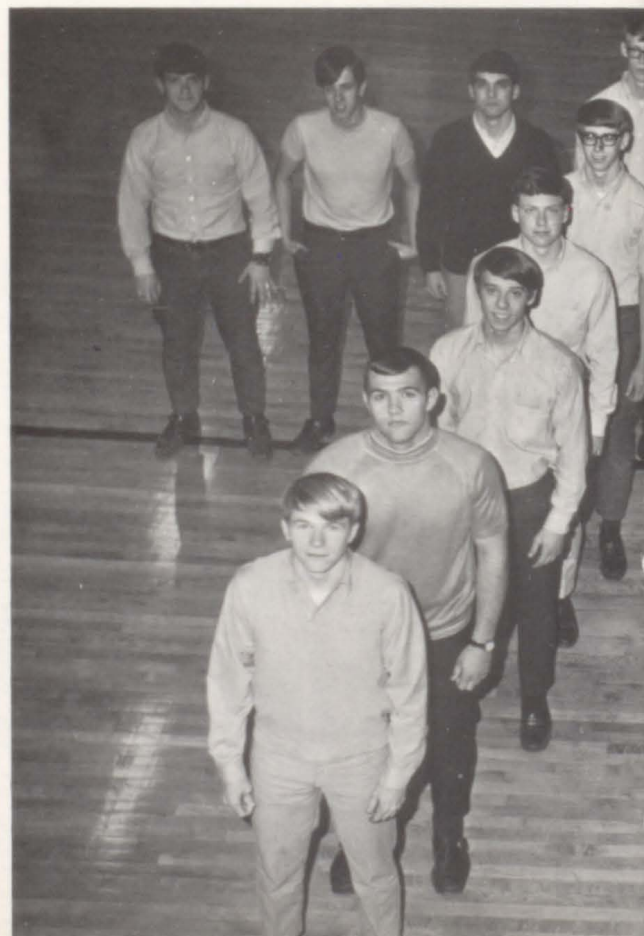

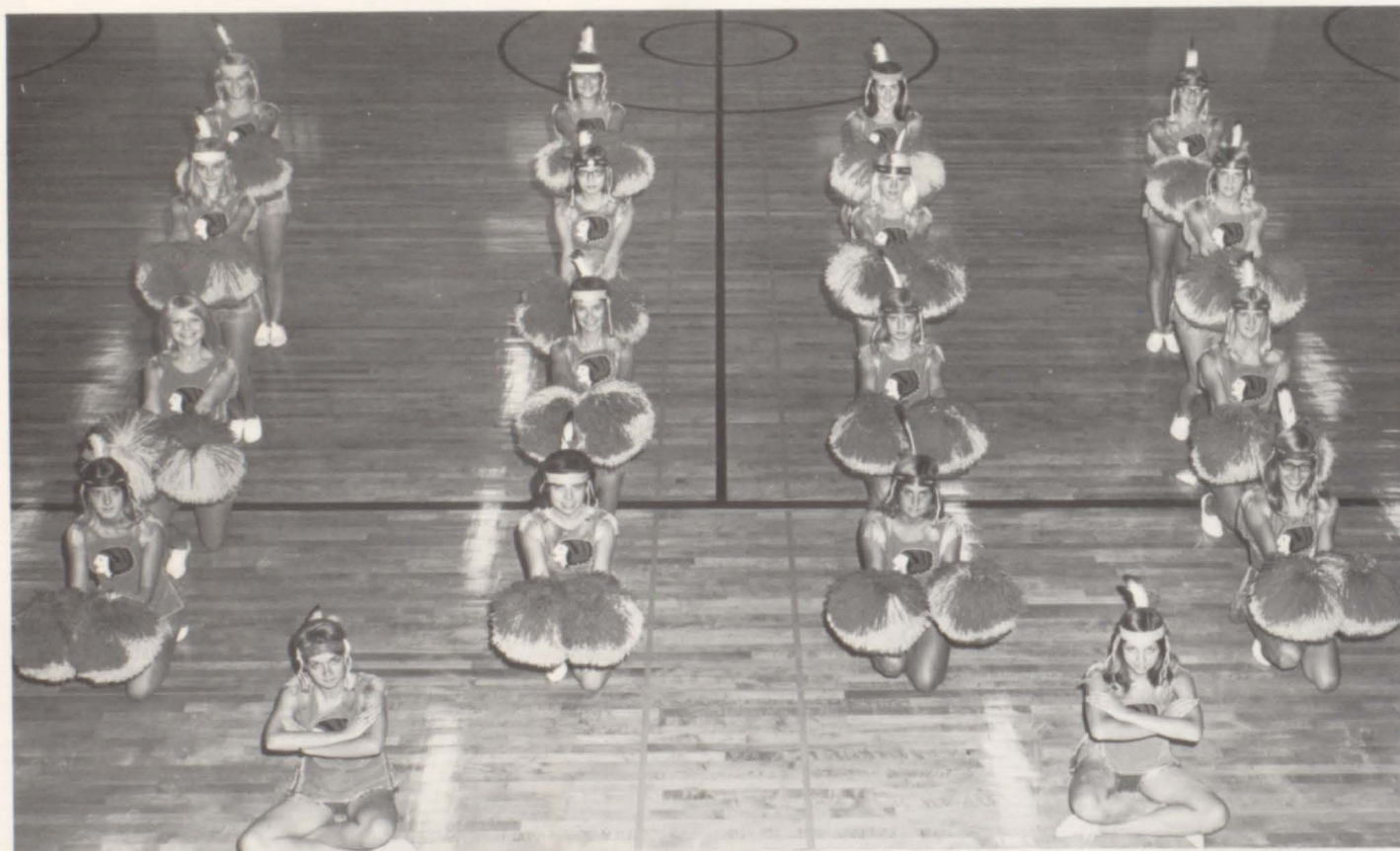

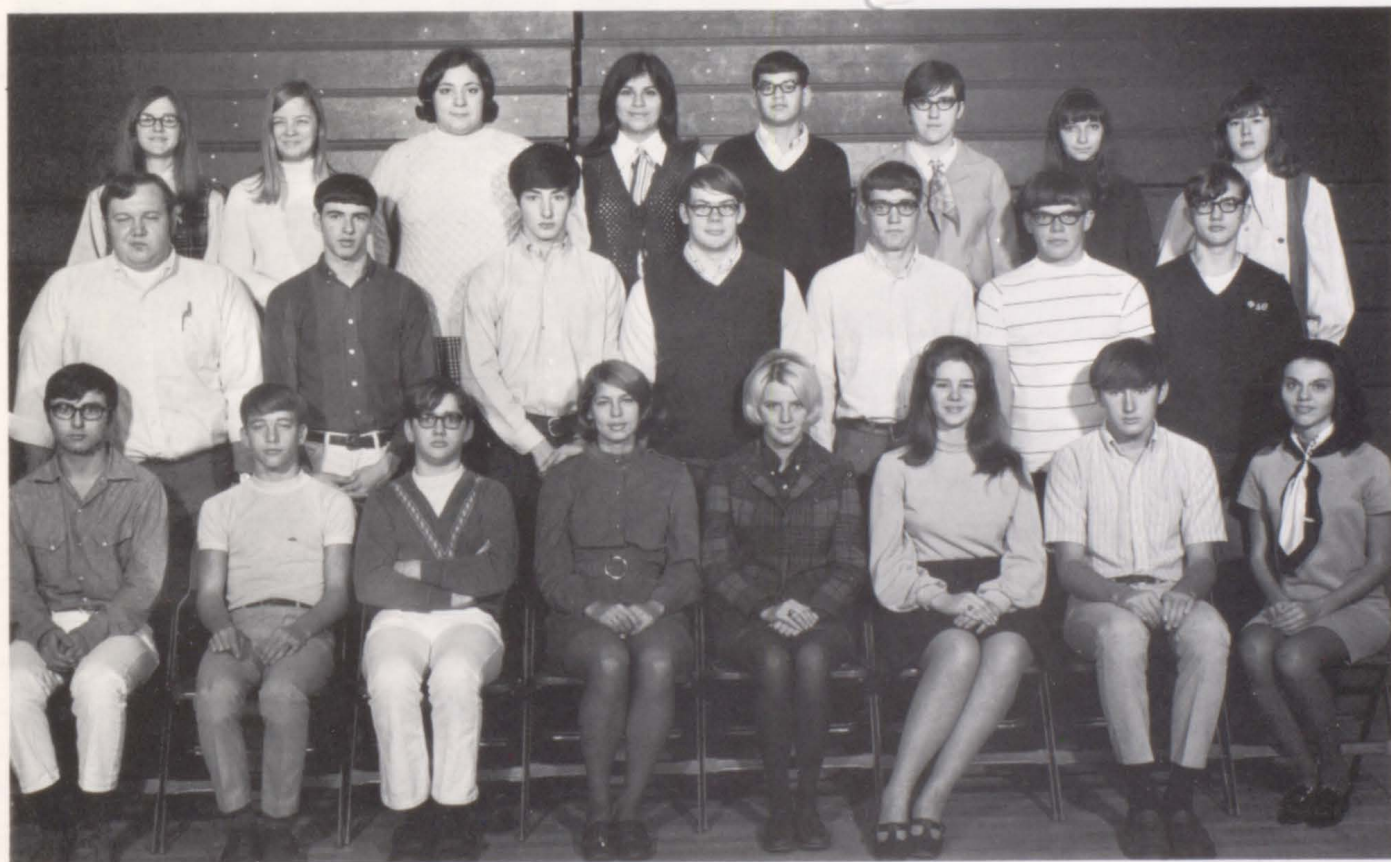
DECA Members Enter Contests

Gymnastics Club Acquires New Skills



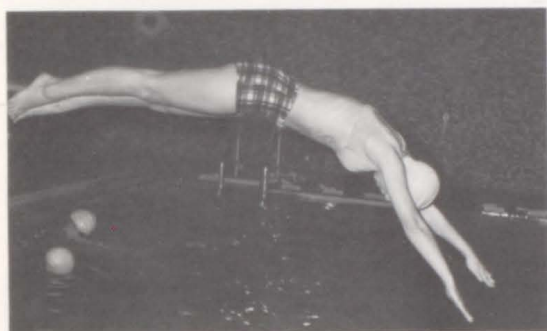

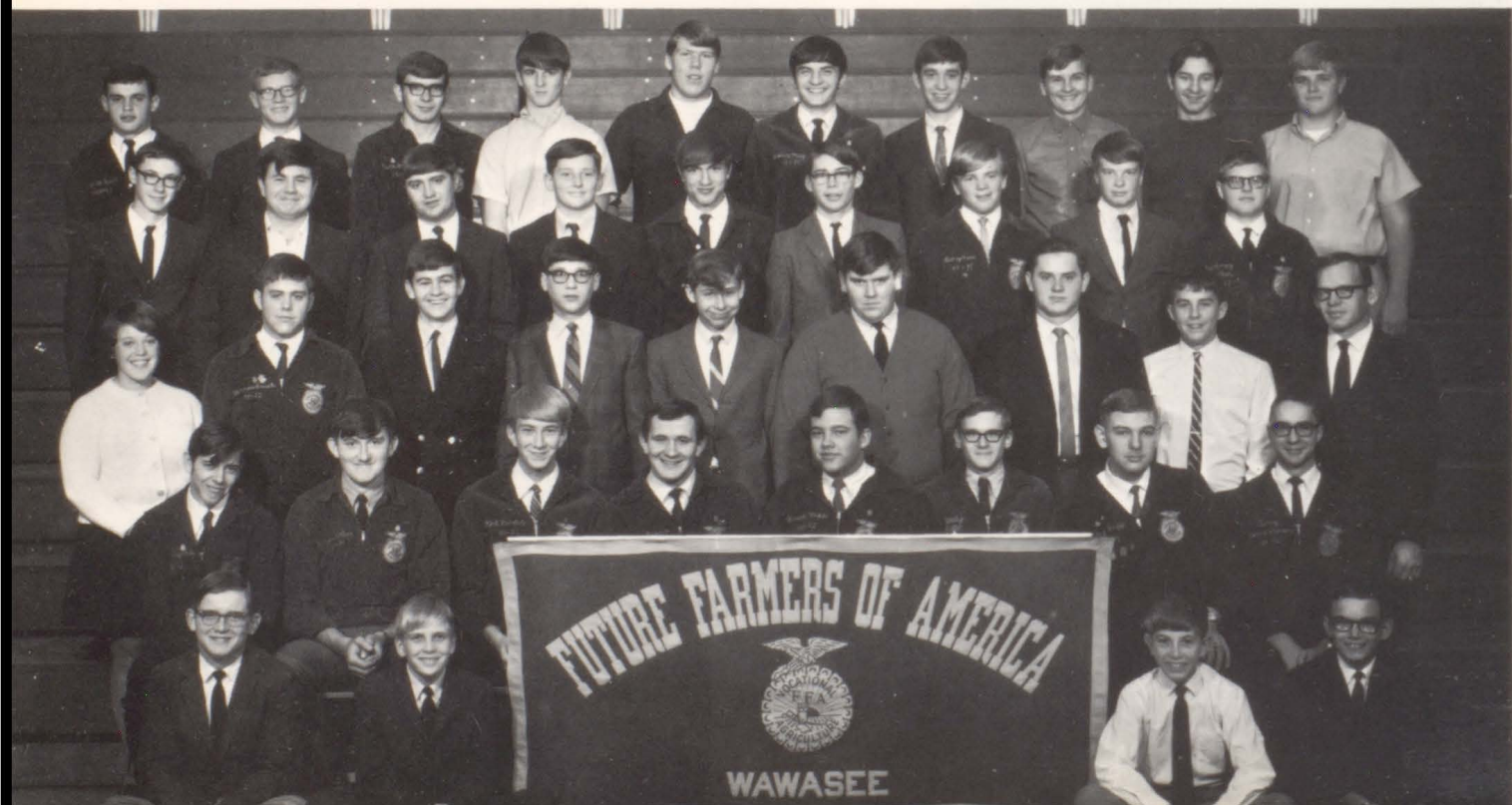
F.F.A. Develops Skills in Farming

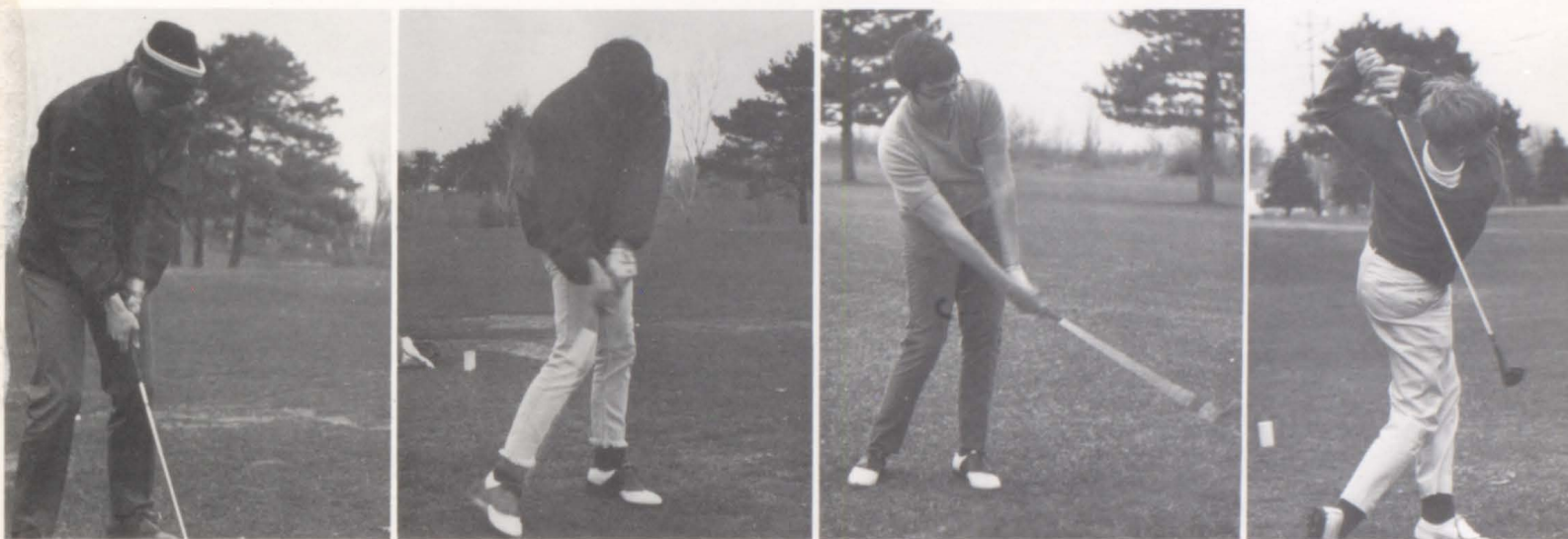
Golfers "Swing" a Winning Season

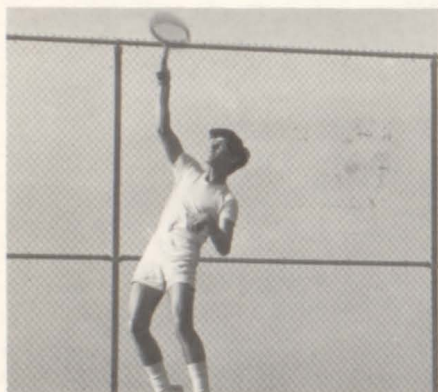


Racketmen "Love" Their New Tennis Court

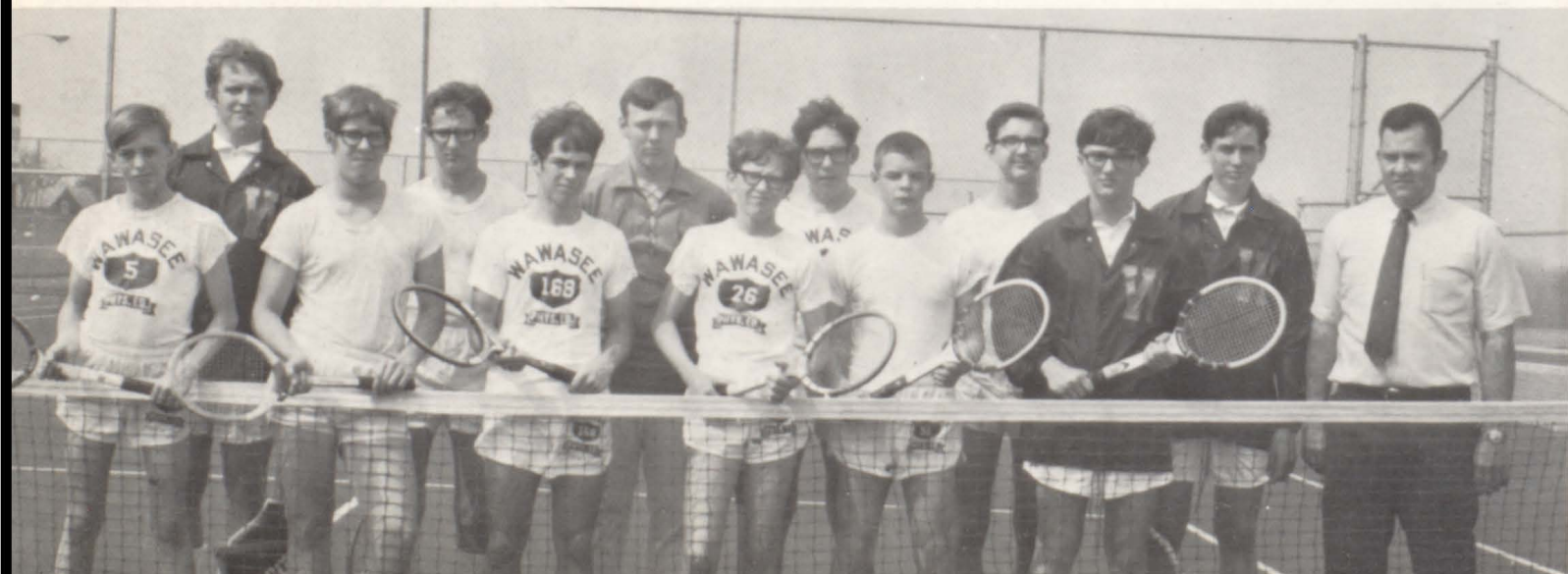
