#### christmas carol banquet: festive










# drama: wilder and schultz






### prom: paradise at twilight


#### foreign language: broadens horizons







### language: builds communications

A combination study of both math and science gave students a better understanding of the close relationship which exists between these two areas of study.











f.t.a.: a beginning for




















#### foreign language: teaches customs


#### industrial arts: gain experience




# tennis: team splits season

#### girl's athletics: a step forward


The feminine segment of WHS emerged this year for the first time to form five spirited competitive teams.




